## The Details:

### Story Times

**Family Story Time**—Stories, songs, rhymes and a simple craft. Geared towards children in preschool and early elementary grades, but younger and older siblings are always welcome to participate. Great for families who are unable to make it to the library during the work/school day. Generally lasts about 45 minutes.

**Preschool Story Time**— Stories, songs, rhymes, movement and a simple craft. Suggested ages: 2-5, with parent/caregiver. Generally lasts about 45 minutes.

**Wee Story Time**— Learn songs, rhymes, bounces and more to repeat at home, plus, we'll share short stories. A great way to expose babies and toddlers to the different aspects of early literacy. Twenty minutes of structured activities, followed by play time. Suggested ages: 6-24 months, with parent/caregiver.

### Pete the Cat Party

Join us for stories, games, crafts and snacks inspired by the book character Pete the Cat! All ages welcome.

### Family Nature Club

This program is geared towards families that want to spend time together participating in nature events. We will meet once a month at the Pulaski Library and occasionally at other locations in the local community. For our September event, we will hold a “meet and greet” and craft program. We will also pick our Family Nature Club names and make a Family Nature Journal (to keep and use daily).
